# Grounding our Commitments and Acknowledging the Land

The Presbyterian Church in Canada acknowledges that it meets, worships and works on the traditional territories of many Indigenous nations and peoples across what is now called Canada. We acknowledge the many treaties and sacred relationships that hold the land.

The church comes from a tradition steeped in an understanding of holy ground and acknowledges that it is still learning how to walk humbly on that ground. Part of this learning to walk humbly, as The Presbyterian Church in Canada, is learning the history of the land and the history of peoples first in relationship with it. And so, we also acknowledge with respect the importance and sacredness of the land to Indigenous peoples and nations who are the traditional keepers of it; the significance the land and waters hold within Indigenous cultural and spiritual practices, and the rooted care for the land, plants, animals, and ecosystems that Indigenous nations and peoples have shown for thousands of years.

We also acknowledge the many treaties that have been made and the importance they hold. We are learning, and continue to deepen our learning, about the covenantal nature of these treaties, and the importance of living out their intent. The lands the church’s national office is on are the traditional territories of the Anishnaabe, Haudenosaunee and Wendat nations. We acknowledge that our national office is on land that is part of the Dish With One Spoon Wampum Covenant—and agreement between the Anishnaabe and Haudenosaunee peoples to equitably share the land’s resources—and Treaty 13, the Toronto Purchase Agreement, which is held by the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation.

Only having first acknowledged with respect and gratitude the First Nations and peoples of these lands and the sacred relationships that hold it, do we acknowledge the church’s identity and marred relationship with the land and the First Peoples as The Presbyterian Church in Canada—a church that participated in colonization and residential schools. Guided by our 1994 Confession, The United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People, The Truth and Reconciliation Commission’s 94 Calls to Action, and our 2024 Apology for our complicity in colonization and the residential school system, the PCC is committed to repair and redress for the harm we caused and to a future of walking humbly on this holy ground.

Each image, each offering, is a reminder that ministry is not confined to pulpits and pews, but flows outward in colour, story and service. Using our hands to create draws us closer to God and contributes to transformative acts of ministry. Through creativity, we glimpse the Spirit at work—stitching us together as community and shaping us as Christ’s people. As the months unfold, may these pages inspire us to notice the artistry around and within us. A child’s drawing taped to a fridge, a hymn sung with heart, a garden planted with care—all are forms of ministry through which God’s love is revealed. In every brushstroke, jar of jam, planted seed and knitted stitch, there is an opportunity to glorify God. When we put our gifts in God’s hands, God does remarkable things.



The congregations of Calvin Presbyterian and Deer Park United in Toronto formed an ecumenical shared ministry to strengthen their witness in the community and to demonstrate their unity in Christ. The combined congregation has a strong pastoral care network, youth and music programs, offers a community breakfast and supports a local church-run food bank. The banner above is made from pieces of fabric brought by individual members of the congregations, taken from meaningful aspects of the church’s ministry, and sewn together as a visual representation of the two congregations united in Christ and in service to the community.

## Digital Collections

## Managing Records

There are guides available to assist congregations and presbyteries in the management of their records. Information covered includes: guidelines for transferring records of dissolved congregations; which digital and physical records are important to maintain; how long to keep financial records; understanding ownership and use of records; storing physical records securely; and organizing digital files on your computer.

## Digitization Program

Did you know the Archives offers a digitization service for congregations and presbyteries? Find out which records are worth copying. Original records are sent to the Archives, copied by our vendor, and preserved by the Archives. The original records are always returned, along with a copy of the newly digitized files. This is a great way to keep your records safe and make them more accessible.
